## Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom opens office in Athens

The Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom (FNF) has opened an office in Athens. The foundation has been active in Greece since 2012 after having been re-invited to Greece by the Greek government. It aims to promote the principle of freedom and the ideas of liberalism in all areas of society, both in Germany and abroad. Partners in Greece are liberal parties, think tanks and civil society organizations. The inaugural reception on the occasion took place at the Institute of International Relations of Panteion University. Many prominent guests accepted the invitation of the foundation.



## FNF Greece: Countering stereotypes and prejudices on the European level

A political heavyweight joined forces with the Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom and its Greek partner organisation "Forum for Greece", who together with the kind support of "Neolaia Evropaiki Ekfrasi" hosted a conference on "North-South Relations in the EU - Clashes of National Stereotypes in a Period of Economic Crisis" in Athens. Kostis Hatzidakis, Greek Minister for Infrastructure and Development, spoke on the political impacts of the sovereign debt crisis and its implications for the relationship between European people. "The eurozone was established to end the 'civil wars' between national currencies", the minister said,

The vice-chairman of the Friedrich Naumann Foundation, Dr. Wolf-Dieter Zumpfort, offered the welcome remarks, expressing his confidence on the Foundation's work "for closer civil society co-operation" in the crisis-ridden country. "but also to guarantee a dynamic Europe where the European peoples move closer together."

German Ambassador Wolfgang Dold reassured the international audience of Germany's commitment to Europe by quoting Germany's Federal President Joachim Gauck: "It is my heartfelt conviction that in Germany more Europe does not mean a German Europe. For us, more Europe means a European Germany!"

France remains a major economic player. It ranks 5th worldwide in terms of GDP per capita and is in 4th position in attracting Foreign Direct Investments (FDI). However, preoccupation about the future of France is growing in Paris and Brussels. Indeed, job creation is stagnating, unemployment rising and entrepreneurs encounter heavy burdens hampering their efforts to do business and thus contribute to economic growth.

Entrepreneurship: unleashing France's potential

France's entrepreneurial potential and the necessary measures to support it were the topics of a conference organized by the European Liberal Forum, Alternative Libérale and the Friedrich Naumann Stiftung's Brussels office on 6 April in Paris at the Société d'encouragement pour l'industrie nationale.

On 8 May, the eve of Europe day, the European Liberal Forum, the Friedrich Naumann Foundation for Freedom, D66 and European partners jointly organise "Celebrating Europe". The programme starts with an interactive session led by Jan Paternotte.

After this session there are interviews in the 'college-tour' format. Emil Kirjas, Secretary-General of Liberal International, will interview economist Ewald Engelen, German-Belgian Culture Minister Isabelle Weykmans and last but not least Vice-President of the European Commission Neelie Kroes. The speakers programme is followed by a cultural and musical programme.
